PURPOSE: To see council approval for the purchase of 2 new zero turn 72 inch mowers.

BACKGROUND:

This would be funded by our 2018 approved capitol budget. We are proposing 2 new 72 inch zero exmark mowers to match the 60 inch ones we have so we can have all the same brand/parts etc. and deplete our existing (2) old Toro's and one last older 60 inch exmark for trade in value.

RECOMMENDATION:

After reviewing all bids/quotes, staff recommends using S and H Farm Supply's quote giving us \$7,000 in trade in for our old mowers and spending a total of \$15,718 total for (2) new 72 inch mowers. This would give us more speed than the Toro's and still have the bigger deck to get the bigger fields mowed more efficiently. We would then have all exmarks to make repairs, use the same parts etc.
